



**COMMERCIAL COUNSELOR/DEPUTY/SCO ENRIQUE (RICK) ORTIZ** is a career foreign service diplomat with the United States Commercial Service, International Trade Administration, U.S. Department of Commerce. He is currently the Commercial Counselor, Deputy Senior Commercial Officer at the U.S. Embassy in Ottawa, Canada. Prior to arriving in Canada, Rick was the Commercial Counselor, Deputy Senior Commercial Officer in Mexico City.

In 1998 Rick was commissioned by President Bill Clinton into the Foreign Service of the United States of America. Rick served as Commercial Attaché at the U.S. Embassy in Bogotá, Colombia, 1998 – 2000, as Senior Commercial Officer to Amman, Jordan, 2001-03, and from 2005-2009 was the Regional Senior Commercial Officer in Casablanca, Morocco responsible for Morocco, Algeria and a partner post in Tunisia.

From May 2003 until January 2004, Rick served under Ambassador Bremmer and the Coalition Provisional Authority as Senior Advisor to the Iraqi Ministry of Industry and Minerals in Baghdad, Iraq, and in summer 2004 he returned to Baghdad and re-opened the Commercial Service operation in Baghdad under Ambassador Negroponte.

Rick completed his Bachelor of Arts in International Relations Management from Claremont McKenna College in 1983. After five years in international sales and marketing throughout Latin American, the Middle East and Africa representing a number of U.S. educational publishing companies, he obtained his Master of Arts in Law and Diplomacy from the Fletcher School of International Law and Diplomacy, Tufts University in 1990.

Rick is a Presidential Management Fellow Class '90, former American Field Service exchange student (Tunisia 77-78), certified American Council on Exercise Group Fitness Instructor, and a certified Advanced PADI scuba diver.
