## Energy & Environment Mission to Thailand, Malaysia & the Philippines

### Join Us

The U.S. Department of Commerce, U.S. Commercial Service is organizing an Energy and Environment Trade Mission to Thailand, Malaysia, and the Philippines from September 15-21, 2013. This mission is designed to provide a powerful opportunity to explore these emerging markets, including briefings, networking receptions, and one-on-one business meetings with potential customers, partners and local representatives.

### Environmental Technology Opportunities in the Region

Thailand, Malaysia, and the Philippines all represent opportunities for U.S. environmental technology firms. Each country has significant issues to deal with, most notably water and wastewater. These countries import most of their water and water treatment equipment, often from U.S. companies. There are also solid waste and emission control opportunities in these markets.

### Why Thailand, Malaysia, and the Philippines?

Malaysia and the Philippines have environmental protections laws in place. Malaysia has adopted a 40% emission reduction by 2020 at the Copenhagen Climate Summit, and also committed to water treatment and to the cleanup of energy projects such as soil remediation. The Philippines also suffer from water-related problems, 20-50% of the population doesn't have access to safe drinking water. The state and local governments fund these projects. Thailand's wastewater market relies heavily on U.S. imports.

**U.S.-Asia-Pacific Comprehensive Energy Partnership:** The United States will provide up to \$6 billion to support the Partnership, with the Ex-Im Bank making \$5 billion available in export credit financing, OPIC providing another \$1 billion dollars in financing.

**Subsector Best Prospects:** water resources and wastewater treatment technology, emission control technology, soil remediation technology
